1906 Schoolhouses with enough power and lights in the 1906 Schoolhouse, making it a convenient site for meetings, lectures, etc. We also have a bathroom and kitchenette in the center utility building, which is made available to those wishing to use the facilities for an event.

Having just sorted out the issues surrounding the new gutters on the utility building, we will need to begin some minor interior work in the kitchen and bathroom which will require some new drywall, flooring, and painting type work, which we try to do ourselves when possible. So, if any of our members who are handy with these types of jobs would like to pitch in, we are always looking for help.

The 1884 School Restoration

We have nearly completed the new floor in the 1884 Schoolhouse and we are in the process of moving much of the actual authentic schoolhouse interior ojects, such as period school desks, wood burning stove, wall hangings etc., into the building in order to make it more of a trip back in time. This will also free up space in the 1906 School making it more available to different types of community events.
